Procedures for Students Opting Out of the State Testing

Overview: Students who choose to opt out of the RISE/Utah Aspire Plus/DLM test will complete an alternative set of assessments that includes a writing task and multiple subject-area assessments. These procedures outline the steps and expectations for students in this process.

1. Alternative Writing Assessment

- Assessment Type: Students will complete a Utah Compose writing prompt for the writing section.
- Preparation:
 - O The teacher will provide a writing promp via Utah Compose.
 - O Teachers will give clear instructions for the writing task, outlining the expected format, length, and focus of the response.
 - O The writing prompt will be graded based via the Utah Compose System.
- **Timeline**: The writing assessment should be completed at the same time as the RISE Writing Assessment and submitted through Utah Compose.
- **Assessment Rubric**: Students will be evaluated based on the standard rubric used for the RISE test, considering aspects like:
 - Content and Development
 - Organization
 - Conventions (grammar, punctuation, etc.)

2. UTIPS Assessment

- Assessment Type: Students will complete a series of assessments through the UTIPS platform in the areas of ELA (English Language Arts), Math, and Science.
- Preparation:
 - Teachers will ensure students have access to the UTIPS platform and understand how to navigate it.
 - o The assessments will be designed by the Local Education Agency (LEA) and will alignment with grade-level standards.

• Assessment Format:

- o ELA: Focused on reading comprehension, vocabulary, and writing skills.
- o Math: Focused on mathematical reasoning, problem-solving, and applied concepts.
- Science: Focused on scientific inquiry, concepts, and principles at the appropriate grade level.

• Timeline:

- o Students will complete each subject-area assessment in their academic classes while the RISE assessment is being completed.
- **Submission**: Once completed, assessments will automatically be submitted through the UTIPS platform.

3. Accommodations and Support

• Instructional Support:

- Teachers will provide appropriate accommodations as necessary (e.g., extended time, a quiet testing environment) in alignment with student needs.
- **Technology Assistance**: Students should report any technical issues (e.g., problems logging into UTIPS, trouble with the Utah Compose platform) to the teacher immediately so that support can be provided.

4. Communication and Monitoring

- **Teacher Oversight**: Teachers will monitor student progress during the completion of the assessments and ensure they are adhering to the timeline.
- Results and Feedback:
 - O UTIPS assessments will be scored automatically on the platform.
