


Dress Code

Bonneville Academy's dress code ensures a positive and respectful learning atmosphere while providing a safe and comfortable environment for all students and staff. The Board of Directors does not wish to impose an additional burden on families by mandating a specific uniform. We reserve the right to revise this dress code policy whenever necessary.

Students shall dress modestly, maintain a neat appearance, and observe proper personal hygiene practices. All students shall wear clean clothing. Students shall not wear mutilated, cut-off, overly distressed, immodest, grungy, or grubby clothes.

General

- Clothing must cover midriff and undergarments at all times even when seated.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must rest no higher than 2" above the knee when standing unless leggings are worn.
- Any slits in dresses or skirts must rise no higher than 2" above the knee when standing.
- Leggings must be opaque, not sheer or transparent.

The following items are **NOT** allowed:

- No hoods or hats may be worn in the building
- No bizarre, extreme, or distracting hairstyles
- No open-toed or open-heeled shoes (entire foot must be covered)
- No wheelie shoes
- No clothes and or hair accessories that may be disruptive or cause safety issues
- No tears, fraying, holes, or distressed clothing
- No clothing related to tobacco, e-cigarettes, alcohol, gang activity, or drugs is permitted
- No clothing that contradicts the educational mission of Bonneville Academy
- No clothing with writing, pictures, or any other symbols that are crude, vulgar, profane, violent, sexually suggestive, promote illegal/criminal activity, or are distracting.
- No gauges or chains.
- No halter tops, tank tops, midriffs, tube tops, or spaghetti straps
- No exposing of the chest; shirts need to be buttoned appropriately
- No ill-fitting bottoms (cannot be too tight)
- No leggings or jeggings without the bottom entirely covered by a tunic top, shorts, or skirt
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Limited dress code exceptions may occur during school-approved activities and designated dress-up days.

The final interpretation of the dress standards will be at the discretion of Bonneville Academy's administrators.

Students who violate dress and grooming standards will be subject to student disciplinary action. An offending student will be offered a clean t-shirt and/or sweatpants. Alternatively, parents may bring an approved change of clothes from home.

Drop Off & Pick Up

Successful Carpool is Everyone's Responsibility

You may not drop off and/or pickup on Montauk Lane. (The street out front of the school) This is mandated by Tooele County. This will be enforced.

Pull up to the front of the line. There is room for 7 vehicles in either parking lot at the curb.

Load and unload your child(ren) from the car door(s) closest to the curb. Students must stay on the sidewalk.

They cannot walk through the parking lot. This is a safety and liability issue.

Parents must remain in their vehicles! If you need to help your child(ren) get buckled, you need to park in a parking space & walk to escort your child(ren) to your vehicle.

Load and unload students quickly. Packing backpacks, fixing clothing, combing hair, and such should be done prior to approaching the curb.

Please park in a parking space.

Be courteous and mindful of others.

Please treat staff with respect. They are trying to keep things running as quickly and smoothly as possible and your student, safety is important to us.
