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### Action Plan to Address Discrepancy (10% or greater) Between Male-Designated and Female-Designated Interscholastic Sports at the School

#### **Basketball**

During the 2024–2025 school year, a discrepancy occurred when jerseys were purchased and donated to the boys' basketball team without prior approval, creating an imbalance between boys' and girls' athletics. Once notified, the school refunded the \$50 fee charged to players since it was not part of the approved fee schedule and reminded staff that all uniform, spirit wear, and donation requests must be reviewed and approved by the Director. Moving forward, LPA will monitor equity between male- and female-designated sports, reinforce policy with coaches, require written approval for purchases and donations, and provide annual training to ensure compliance with Title IX and the school's commitment to gender equity in athletics.

#### **Volleyball**

For volleyball, two main discrepancies were noted. First, with a new coach in place, the end-of-season celebration consisted of a player-versus-parents/staff scrimmage game rather than the more traditional format of a banquet/awards ceremony, creating some inconsistency in team experiences. Second, no treats or gifts were included at that celebration. To address this, the coach has committed to adding treats and/or small gifts for players in future end-of-year events to ensure greater alignment with schoolwide practices and equity across athletic programs.
