



VISION SCREENINGS

The Utah Division of Health requires that students be screened for distance visual acuity each school year. Vision screenings may take place at any point during the school year; however, every effort is made to complete screenings within 60 days of the start of school.

School vision screenings are coordinated by the front office and conducted with the assistance of trained parent volunteers and school staff. Please note that school vision screenings are not a substitute for a comprehensive eye examination by an eye care specialist.

Only students who do not pass the vision screening will receive a referral letter. Even if your child passes the screening, it is still important for them to visit an eye care specialist annually. School vision screenings do not evaluate overall eye health and cannot detect all vision problems or prescribe treatment.

You will receive an email notification prior to your child's scheduled vision screening. Please ensure your child wears their glasses or contact lenses to school on the day of the screening, if applicable. If you do not want your child to participate in the school vision screening, you must notify the front office upon receiving the screening notification.
