A school fee is defined as "...something of monetary value requested or required by a Local Education Agency (LEA) as a condition to a student's participation in an activity, class, or program provided, sponsored, or supported by a school..."

Activity or Program Sponsored by or supported by an LEA means:

1. Part of an employee's work assignment or could lead a reasonable person to conclude it is part of an employee's work assignment
2. Explicitly or implicitly required as a condition of a higher grade, completion of, or full participation in a class or activity



3. Actively encouraged by school employee or could lead a reasonable person to conclude that outside regular school hours activity is actively encouraged by school employee or sponsor or coach.

Fundraisers

1. Are allowed to replace a board approved fee if:
 - a. All participants are required to participate in it to get the funds from the fundraiser applied to their school fee not just kids on school fee waivers
 - b. If a student has paid the fee either monetarily or with community service then they cannot be required to participate in the fundraiser
 - c. Must be appropriate for age of students
 - d. Only for students in 7th 12th grades

Fee vs Fine: A fee means something of monetary value, requested or required by an LEA, which includes fines such as: • truancy; • tardies; • class changes; • fines or penalties designed to influence a student's behavior. (R277-407-2(4)(a); R277-407-2(19); 53G-7-501(6)(b)(vi)) and therefore, are subject to the requirements of UAC R277-407 and UCA 53G-7; • Included on the board approved fee schedule. • Have a corresponding spend plan. • Are subject to fee waivers. • Must be equal to or less than the expense incurred by the LEA. • May not supplant or subsidize another fee. (R277-407-8(1)(a); R277-407-6(1); 53G-7-503(3)(a) & (b))

A fine is NOT a fee, if it is one of the exceptions • Failing to return school property; • Losing, wasting, or damaging private or school property through intentional, careless, or irresponsible behavior, or as described in 53G-8-212 (no penalty for damages attributed to normal wear and tear); • Improper use of school property, including a parking violation. (R277-407-2(19)(b)(iv); 53G-7-501(6)(c)(i)(A)-(C)) Reminder: Throughout the school fees regulations in Utah Code Annotated (UCA) 53G-7 Part 5 and R277-407, school fees are designated as singular (i.e., "a student" and "an activity"). School fees funds are restricted for a single student's participation in a single activity, course, or program. Therefore, fines that are considered a fee, i.e., truancy fine, the specific spend plan should delineate how those funds will used.
